# **IMS2020** Author Instructions

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# 1. Key Information

- The deadline for initial paper submissions is 23:59 Hawaii Standard Time (HST), 4 December 2019.

  Deadlines are absolute Please do not ask for extensions!
- Authors must adhere to the format provided in the <u>IMS2020 Paper Template for Microsoft Word or</u> the <u>IMS2020 Paper Template for LaTeX.</u>
- Papers will be evaluated according to the four criteria in the <a href="MS2020 Call for Papers"><u>IMS2020 Call for Papers</u></a>.
- The abstract that you enter at the Electronic Paper Management System (EPMS) submission portal
  is strictly limited to 150 words; longer abstracts will be rejected. However, the abstract length in your
  paper itself does not have this limit and can be longer, if desired.
- The initial paper length should be 3-4 pages, including all figures, tables, references, etc.
- The submission must be in PDF format, and the size cannot exceed 2 MB. Please do not ask for exceptions to these limits!
- Papers must be submitted using the <u>IMS2020 Paper Submission Website</u> as described in the following pages. Hardcopy and email submissions will not be accepted.
- The instructions in this document are also applicable to papers submitted to Focus and Special Sessions.







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#### 2. Overview

These instructions are intended to guide you through the paper submission process for the <u>2020 IEEE MTT-S International Microwave Symposium</u> (IMS2020). Your initial paper, due on 4 December 2019, is used by the IMS2020 Technical Program Review Committee (TPRC) to evaluate the suitability of including your work in the symposium.

An email notification to all authors regarding the disposition (acceptance or rejection) of their papers is anticipated to be sent out on 10 February 2020. If your paper is accepted, you will be asked to submit your final paper by 4 March 2020 for publication in the symposium digest.

These instructions apply only to <u>2020 IEEE MTT-S International Microwave Symposium</u> authors. As shown in the <u>IMS2020 Call for Papers</u>, authors have 33 technical areas from which to select, over a dozen of which are applicable to RF, microwave, or millimeter-wave integrated circuits (ICs) and their technologies. Authors of IC-related papers can also consult the <u>RFIC 2020 website</u> for further information. If you are unsure whether your paper is best suited to IMS2020 or RFIC 2020, please review both websites.

## 3. Double-Blind Review Policy

IMS2020 will continue the double-blind reviewing policy used since IMS2011. A double-blind review process creates 'anonymity' for both authors and reviewers. The reviewers will not be informed of the authors' names or affiliations in the submitted paper; such information must therefore be redacted from the paper before submission. A double-blind review process is intended to eliminate any perception of bias for or against an author or his/her institution based on name recognition, country, gender, or other characteristics. This helps assure authors of the following:

- All submitted papers are judged equally, based on established evaluation criteria.
- The content and quality of submitted papers are judged and not the authors or their affiliations.

Beyond the obvious need to remove names and affiliations, there are a number of additional changes required to prepare a paper for a double-blind review. For example, citation of prior work is required to evaluate a submission. Referencing the authors' own work should be worded in a way that avoids identifying connections to the authors. Simply cite your prior work in the same way that you cite work by others. For example, do not write "We demonstrated in [2] that ..." Rather, write "It was demonstrated in [2] that..." The author must take every possible step to make the submission anonymous and avoid identification by inference. To make the process as simple as possible we can reduce the procedure to just a few steps shown below. Papers submitted to IMS2020 that disregard these double-blind review requirements will not be reviewed.

- 1. Eliminate author names, contact information, and affiliations from the title and anywhere else;
- 2. Eliminate acknowledgments and references to funding sources;
- 3. Use the third person to refer to the authors' own work;







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- 4. Ensure figures do not contain any affiliation-related identifier (e.g. logos on hardware or in IC layouts);
- 5. Depersonalize the work by using anonymous text where necessary;
- 6. Remove or depersonalize citations to authors' unpublished work;
- 7. Remove references to patents filed by authors or their institutions.

One of the most common misunderstandings of the double-blind review policy concerns the reference list at the end of the paper. The table below illustrates the correct and incorrect way of handling this, assuming that J. A. Doe and J. B. Doe are the names of you and your co-author:

#### Correct handling of cited references

"This paper builds on the previous research of [2] by highlighting some of the recent advances..."

[2] J. A. Doe and J. B. Doe, "Previous research: a review," in 2014 Int. Conf. on Writing Conf. Papers, Luckenbach, TX, USA, Jun. 2014, pp. 1721–1734.

Use anonymous, third-person language when referring to your own work. Do not redact any references, including your own.

#### **Incorrect** way of handling cited references

"In this paper, we build on our previous research [2] and highlight some of the recent advances..."

[2] (Redacted – double blind), "Previous research: a review," in 2014 Int. Conf. on Writing Conf. Papers, Luckenbach, TX, USA, Jun. 2014, pp. 1721–1734.

Do not use first-person language such as "we" and "our" when referring to your own work. Do not redact any references, including your own.

For additional examples of how to avoid double-blind violations, refer to "Recent Advances in Eliminating Double-Blind Violations in Conference Papers", authored by Ryan Gough.

If your initial paper is accepted, the final archived version of the paper must be modified to reinstate the information removed above in your initial paper submission. Refer to Section 6 to compare the initial versus final paper submission requirements.

# 4. Initial Paper Submission Instructions

Prospective authors must electronically submit their initial paper via the <u>IMS2020 Paper Submission</u> <u>Website</u> by **23:59 Hawaii Standard Time (HST), 4 December 2019**. Deadlines are absolute. Please do not ask for extensions. Authors must adhere to the IEEE two-column format as illustrated in the <u>IMS2020 Paper Template for Microsoft Word or the IMS2020 Paper Template for La-TeX.</u>

At its discretion, IMS2020 may use the abstract that you enter into the submission system in the symposium program book, on-line content, and other materials. The abstract that you enter into the EPMS submission website is strictly limited to 150 words; longer abstracts will be rejected. The abstract length in the paper itself does not have this limit, and can be longer, if desired.







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The initial paper length should be **3-4 pages**, including all figures, tables, references, etc. The submission must be in PDF format, and the size cannot exceed **2 MB**. Please do not ask for exceptions to these limits!

Use your own conversion software to convert your initial paper to PDF. The initial paper does not have to be compatible with IEEE Xplore. Sometimes authors may encounter difficulties with photographic images and the 2-MB size limit. This usually occurs when pictures are taken using a high-resolution digital camera, and the image is pasted directly into the paper. Use compression on photos and figures to reduce the size, and work this out well in advance of the deadline! **Do not submit copyright forms with the initial paper submission.** 

#### 4.1. Submitting Your Initial Paper – Overview

All submissions must be submitted electronically via the <u>IMS2020 Paper Submission Website</u>. The submission process consists of four steps:

Step 1. Convert your paper to PDF format using your own conversion software.

**Step 2.** Go to the <u>IMS2020 Paper Submission Website</u> and either Create a New User Account for the submitting author or log in using an existing account.

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#### Step 3. Add New Submission.

- a. Add Participants Enter the information for each of the co-authors that you will use on all of your submissions, i.e. for all of your papers. Each participant will later be presented in a dropdown menu to select from later in the submission process. You will need the name, affiliation, full address, phone number, and email address for each person.
- b. Enter your submissions You will be asked to enter the following information to complete a new submission:
  - Enter your title
  - Select the co-authors
  - Select the speaker
  - Select three topic areas please see the <u>IMS2020 Call for Papers</u> for a complete list. These
    are presented in a dropdown list.
  - Enter your abstract of 150 words or less
  - Upload the PDF file of your paper
  - Answer a set of presentation questions
  - Confirm all organizational approvals
- c. Submit the paper

Step 4. Confirm that the PDF file submission is the most current and correct file.

Important Note to Authors Submitting a Focus or Special Session Paper: Focus and Special Session papers are those that have been solicited or invited by the Focus or Special Session organizers, and approved by the IMS2020 Technical Program Committee. If you are submitting an approved Focus or Special Session paper, you need the "Approval Code" that you received from your session organizer and/or the IMS2020 Technical Program Committee. You will need to enter it during the above Step 3b. Failure to do so may result in your paper being automatically rejected without any review.

Please read the following directions for more detailed step-by-step instructions.

#### 4.2. Submitting Your Initial Paper – Step by Step

**Step 1.** Convert your paper to PDF format using your own PDF conversion software. The initial paper does not have to be compatible with IEEE Xplore. Ensure that your paper meets all the guidelines specified in the <a href="IMS2020 Paper Template">IMS2020 Paper Template for Microsoft Word</a> or the <a href="IMS2020 Paper Template">IMS2020 Paper Template for LaTeX</a>.

- Paper length three or four pages
- PDF file format (cannot exceed 2 MB)
- All double-blind review requirements are followed, e.g. author names/affiliations should be redacted, cited references should not be redacted, etc. See Section 3 above for more detail.







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


Step 2. 

#### Add a New Submission








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




THE SUBMISSION PAGE APPEARS.

**#1 Submission Tracking** – This information gives you the name of the person responsible for the paper submission and the date of the submission. You are asked to enter the title of your paper in the text box. **NOTE:** Do not use all upper case or all lower case since this information may appear, as you enter it, in official publications.

#2 Select Co-Authors – In this section you will use the dropdown menu to select the authors for the paper in the order that you want them to be published if the paper be accepted. All authors of the paper should have been input during the Add Participants stage. See page 8, #1 for instructions.









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




**#3 Select Speaker** – Use the dropdown menu to select the speaker of your paper. The speaker has to be an author of the paper and should have been input during the Add Participants stage. See page 8, #1 for instructions.



**#4 Topic Area** – Use the dropdown menus to select the three topic areas that most clearly describe your paper.



**#5 Enter Abstract** – Enter an abstract for your paper of 150 words or less. **NOTE:** The abstract entered on the submission page must be 150 words or less or it will not be accepted. The abstract in the paper itself does not have a limit and can be longer.

#6 Upload File - Use the "Choose File" button to identify the file that you wish to submit. The file name will then appear in the box next to the "Choose File" button. Please make sure your file size does not exceed the 2-MB limit. The paper must strictly adhere to Double-Blind Review Policy as discussed in Section 3 above.

# UPLOAD FILE The initial submission may be 3 or 4 pages, must be in PDF format, must be double-blind compliant, and cannot exceed 2 MB in size. Hardcopy and email submissions are not accepted. The final page length for papers accepted for publication in the proceedings is 3 to 4 pages. File size is limited to 2MB Any previous uploaded files will be overwritten.

**#7 Presentation Questions -** Next, you will be presented with a series of questions regarding presentation format and optional competitions:

- Submission Type: Please select the option that best fits your paper.
- "Indicate your preferred presentation format" You can select either the "Oral Presentation" or "Interactive Forum" format. If you select "Oral Presentation", you will be asked to select either Full length (20 minutes) or Short length (10 minutes). See the <a href="IMS2020 Call for Papers">IMS2020 Call for Papers</a> for details about these styles of presentations.
- "Enter Student Paper Competition" The purpose of the Student Paper Competition (SPC) is to recognize outstanding technical contributions from individual students. The first author of the paper must be a student. Faculty advisors will be contacted for verification only for those papers that are selected as SPC Finalists in March 2020. Detailed information on student paper guidelines and eligibility are described in the IMS2020 Student Paper Competition Rules.







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- Is this presentation for a Special Session or Focus Session? Most authors should answer "No" to this question. Select "Focus Session" or "Special Session" only if your paper has been solicited or invited by the Focus or Special Session organizers, and approved by the IMS2020 Technical Program Committee. If you are submitting an approved Focus or Special Session paper, you need the "Approval Code" that you received from your session organizer and/or the IMS2020 Technical Program Committee. Authors who were invited to submit Focus or Special Session papers must follow all technical paper guidelines. Complying with the double-blind review policy is required for Focus Session papers, and similar to regular papers, they will be evaluated according to the four criteria in the IMS2020 Call for Papers. Complying with the double-blind review policy is not required for Special Session papers.
- "Enter Industry Paper Competition?" The purpose of the IPC is to recognize outstanding technical contributions from industry sources. Eligible papers can have several authors but the work described must come from a corporate or otherwise private source, not a government or academic institution. Details can be found in the IMS2020 Industry Paper Competition Rules.
- "Enter Advanced Practices Paper Competition?" The purpose of the APPC is to recognize
  outstanding technical contributions that apply to practical applications. Eligible papers could have
  authors in any sector (industry/government/academic/etc.). Details can be found in the <a href="IMS2020">IMS2020</a>
  Advanced Practices Paper Competition Rules.
- "Enter the Three Minute Thesis (3MT®) Competition?" The purpose of the 3MT® Competition is to showcase students and young professionals who have distilled their technical research into a presentation of three minutes or less, supported only by one static slide. To be considered, the author must be a student or young professional (YP); YPs are defined by IEEE as post-student members who are within 15 years of receiving their first professional degree. Details can be found in the <a href="IMS2020">IMS2020</a> Three Minute Thesis (3MT®) Competition Rules.
- \*Enter student demonstrations? Student authors of accepted papers are encouraged to present a
  table-top demonstration of their research at the conference. You will be asked to submit a brief onepage abstract, describing your demonstration and outlining infrastructure requirements, if applicable,










#### 4.3. Editing/Updating a Submission

**Step 1.** If you wish to edit/update your submission in the future, you will log into the <u>IMS2020 Paper</u> Submission Website. The Navigation Center home page will list your submissions.



**Step 2.** Click on the "View" button next to the submission you would like to update.

#### **Step 3.** There are three options:

- Edit Submission Form or Upload Paper This allows the submitting author to edit the submission form or upload a new PDF file submission.
- View Submission File This allows the submitting author to download a copy of the PDF submission to ensure it is the correct file.
- Correct Your Information Opens a box with submitting author's full contact information and has a link to allow the submitting author to edit/update personal information.







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


#### 4.4. Withdrawing a Submission

Withdrawing a submitted submission **AFTER** the submission deadline of 4 December 2019 is strongly discouraged. It is our policy that if a paper must be removed after the final approval date for the symposium proceedings (10 April 2020), it will be done at the author's and/or the sponsoring organization's expense.








## 5. Initial Paper Review and Disposition

All initial papers will be reviewed and ranked by the IMS2020 TPRC according to the four criteria in the IMS2020 Call for Papers. The review process occurs during the December 2019 – January 2020 time frame, and all authors will subsequently be notified whether their paper was accepted or rejected. Historically, the acceptance rate has been approximately 50%. An email notification to all authors is anticipated to occur on 5 February 2020 regarding the disposition (accepted or rejected) status. Please do not contact us before then to ask about the disposition of your paper. You may also log into the IMS2020 Paper Submission Website to check the paper disposition status on or after 5 February 2020.

# 6. Final Paper Submission

All authors of accepted papers must submit the final version of their paper no later than 4 March 2020. The final paper can be up to 4 pages. You must resubmit your paper, even if no changes are made to your initial submission!







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Complete instructions for submitting your final paper will be provided after 1 February 2020, but the key differences between the initial paper and final paper are shown in the table below.
